LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading: Wisdom 3:1-6, 9

A reading from the Book of Wisdom

The souls of the just are in the hand of God and no torment shall touch them.

They seemed, in the view of the foolish, to be dead;

and their passing away was thought an affliction and their going forth from us, utter destruction.

But they are in peace.

For if in the eyes of men, indeed, they be punished, yet is their hope full of immortality;
Chastised a little, they shall be greatly blessed, because God tried them, and found them worthy of himself.

The Covenant Hymn by Rory Cooney and Gary Daigle is based on Ruth 1:16-17a. In the biblical context, the relationship between Ruth and Naomi (daughter-in-law to mothr-in-law) is a reflection of the faithful love of God offered to Israel and to us in the gift of covenant. Their story illustrates the power of mutual commitment between persons. When we choose to surrender to loving another person, we form a relationship that testifies to God's faithfulness and not just our own.

Ruth and Naomi also shared a mutual commitment to survival (both widows). Sometimes a great and necessary mission can be the place where we discover our own gifts and in the process discover God's abiding and creative presence with us. Faithful love is an abiding mark of the covenant; few stories capture that lesson better than this one.
